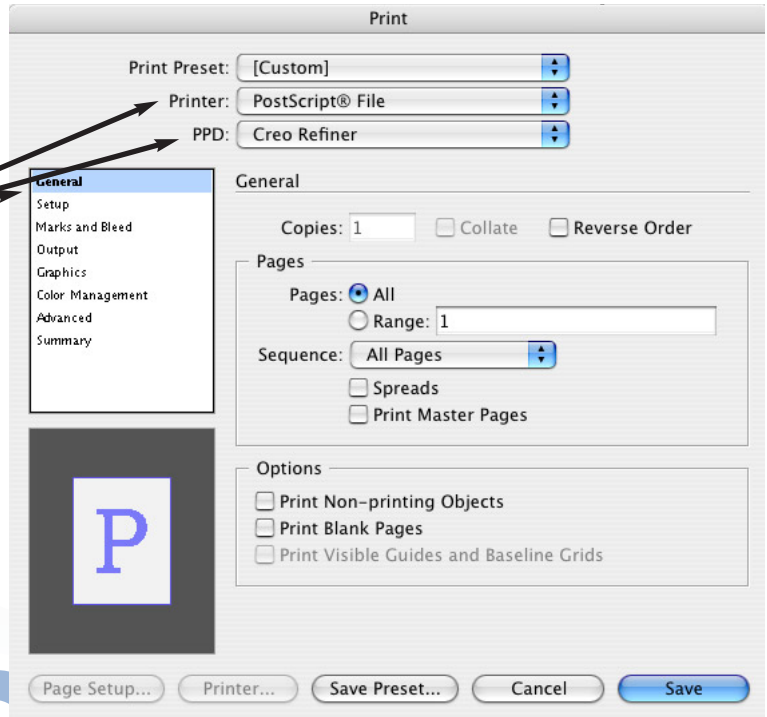


Creating a Postscript File in IndesignCS_Mac

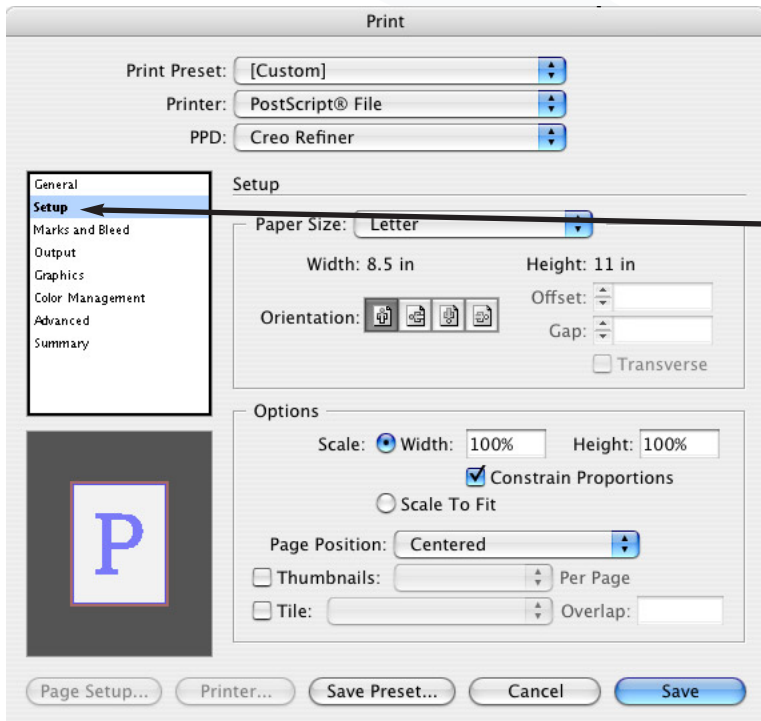
Follow these directions to Print a Postscript file in IndesignCS on a Macintosh running OS X

When you have completed your job, click on "File" then "Print".

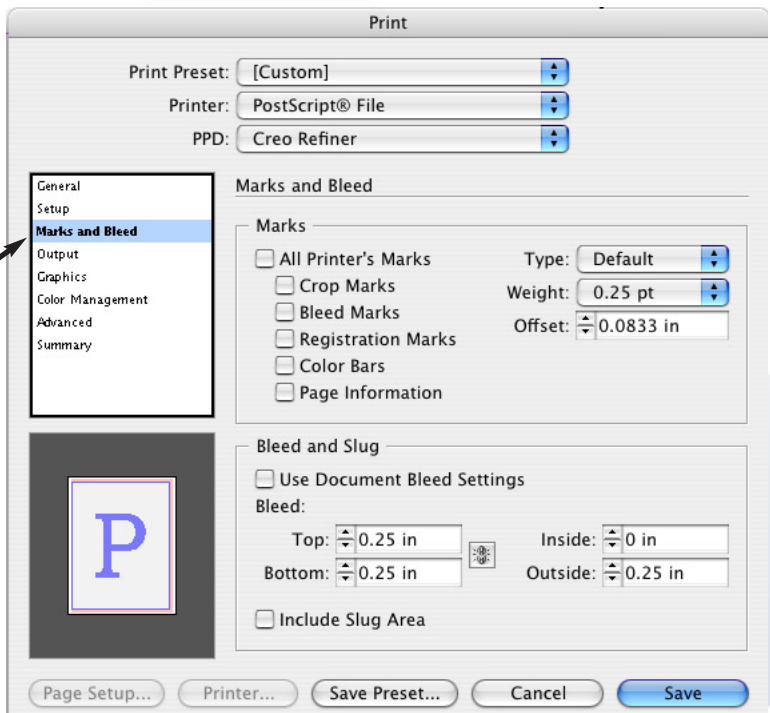
1. The "General" tab should look as follows. Make sure you select the "Creo Refiner" in PPD Popup and Postscript File in the Printer Popup. Then set the rest of this tab for your job.

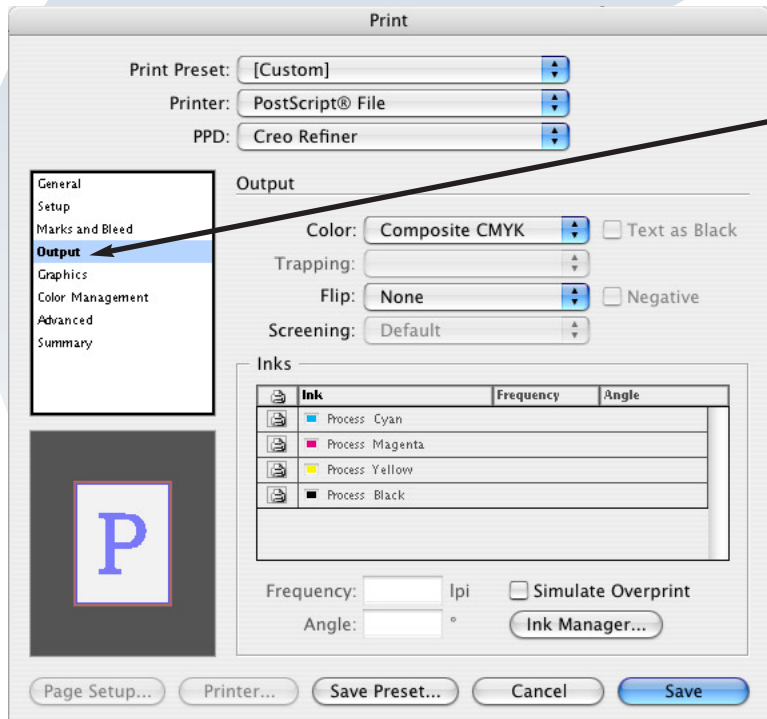


2. The "Setup" tab should look as follows.



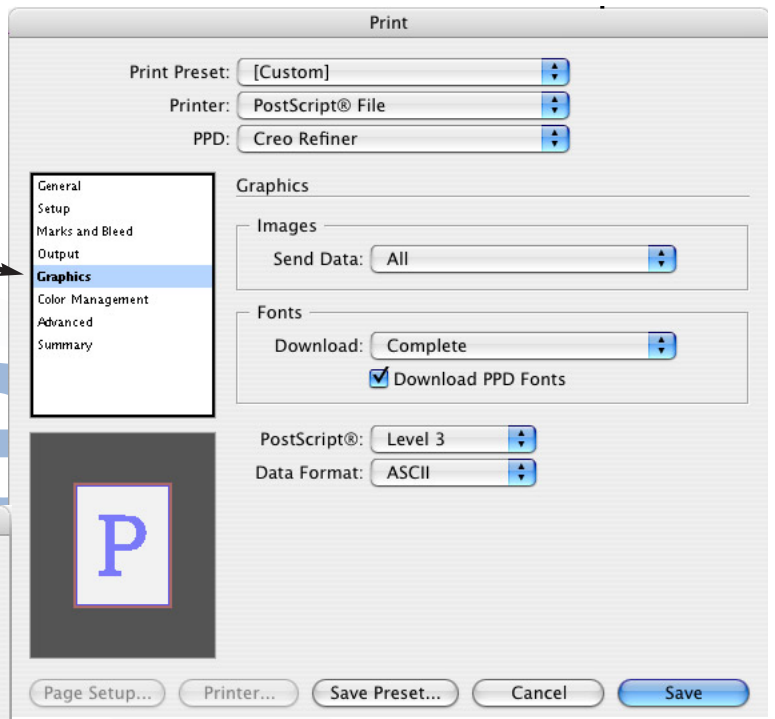
3. The "Marks and Bleeds" tab should look as follows.



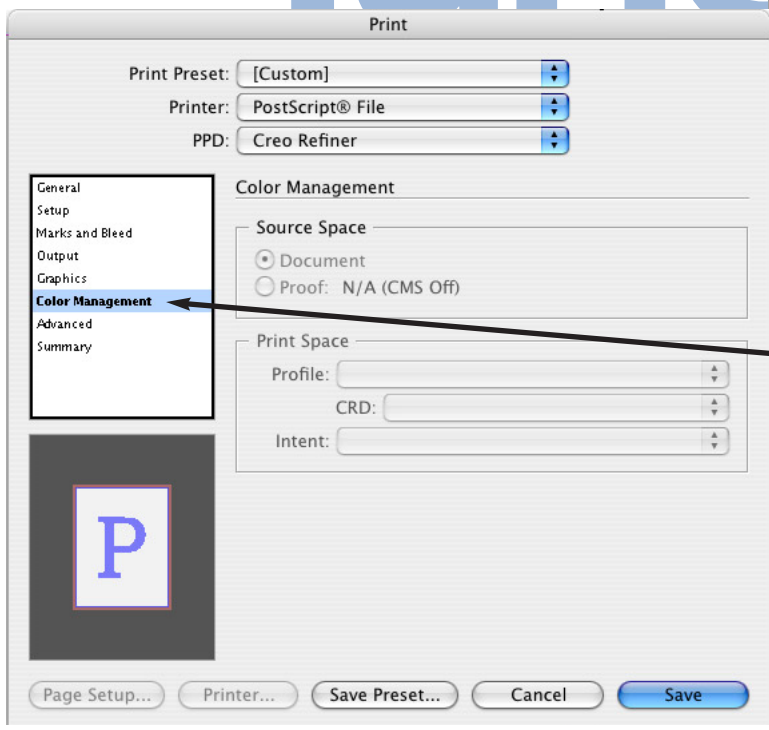


4. The "Output" tab should look as follows.

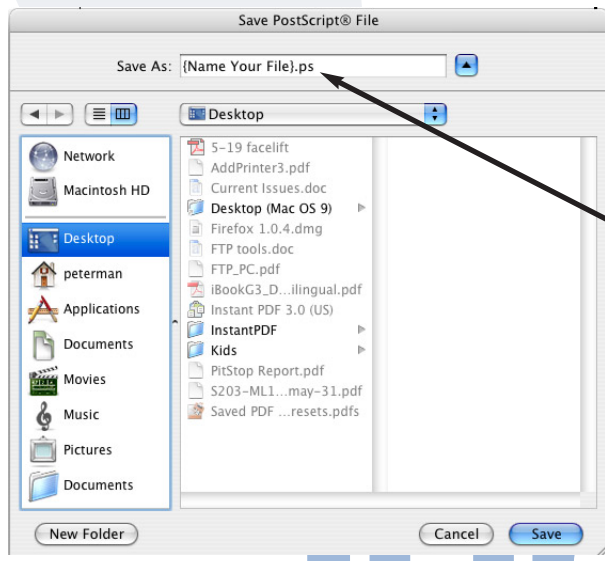
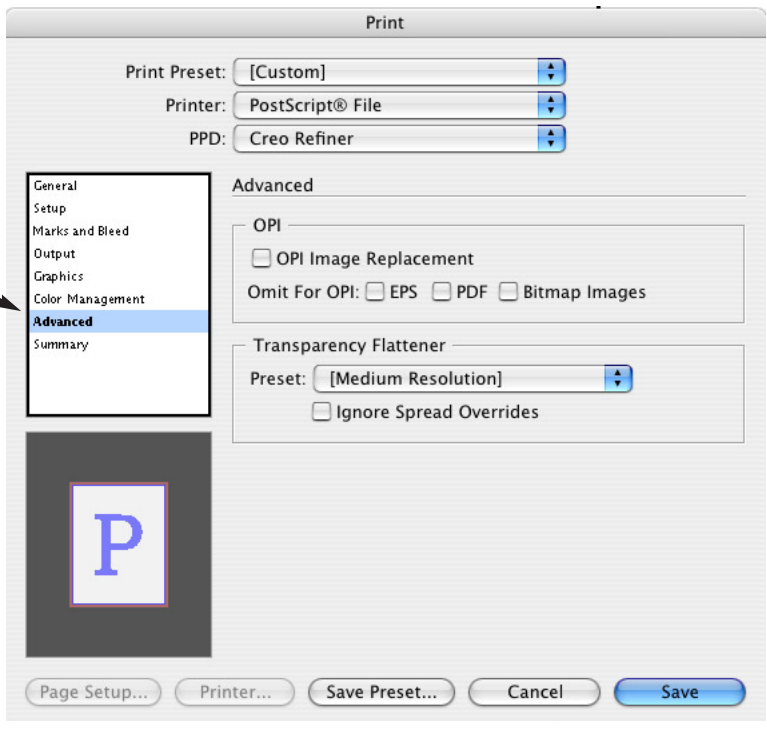
5. The "Graphics" tab should look as follows.



6. The "Color Management" tab should look as follows.

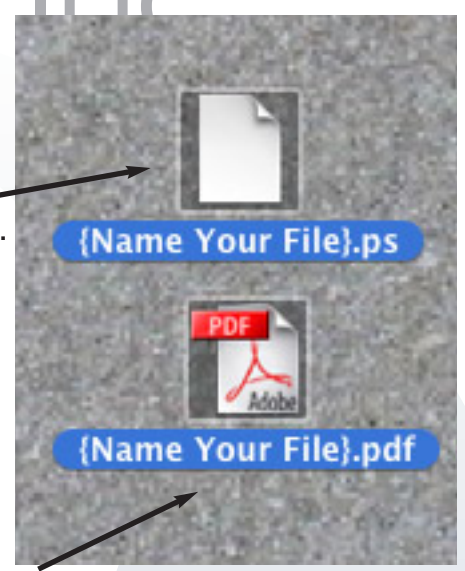


7. The "Advanced" tab should look as follows.



9. Click on "Save" and you will see another screen pop up. Name your file in the "Save As" box and save in a location you will remember. Then click "Save".

11. After you save the file it will show up as with a ".ps" extension which is what you will use in Distiller with the Turley Distiller settings.



12. With Distiller Launched and the default settings set to the Turley Distiller Settings, drag that file in the middle of the Distiller screen and let go. a PDF with then show up in the same location as the ".ps" file you just created.
