

# Creating a Postscript File in PageMaker 6.5 and 7

This document will point out key things that you will do and will walk you through on how to make a Postscript file ready for Distiller to create a PDF. Keep in mind that every job is different, but it is important to follow the black arrows and adjust the rest to your document.

## IMPORTANT NOTES:

**Do NOT use any "Export For PDF" in any application. This does not work for the "print" industry.**

**You must create a Postscript printer before this step. Follow the [WIN\\_AddPrinter.pdf](#) on how to do this.**

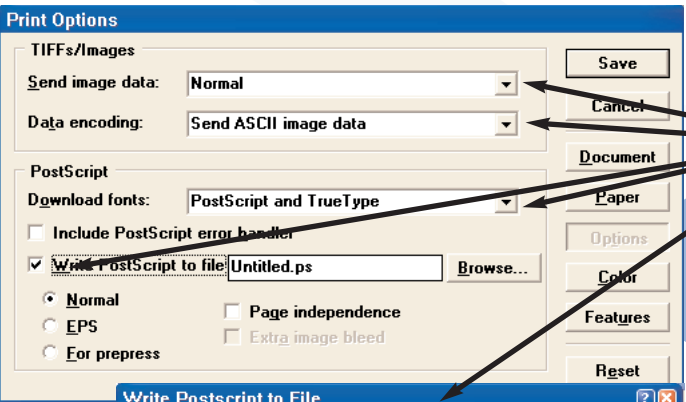
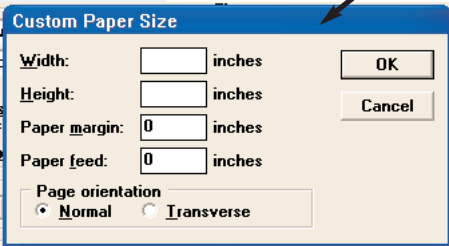
Once you have finished your PageMaker job, linked all the images and setup all the fonts, you will go to **File** at the Top of the Menu and **Print**. Follow these next steps and pictures to achieve a good Postscript file.



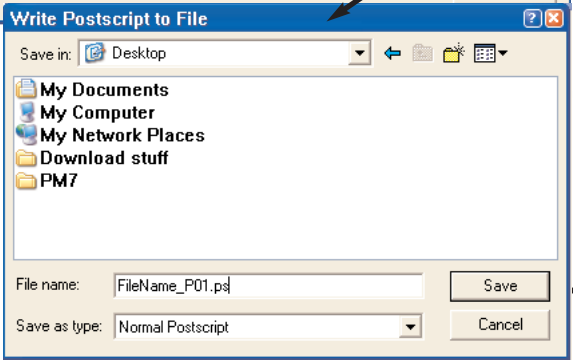
1. Make Sure "Printer" is set to "**Turley Prinergy Refiner on File**" and the "**PPD**" is set to "**Prinergy Refiner**".



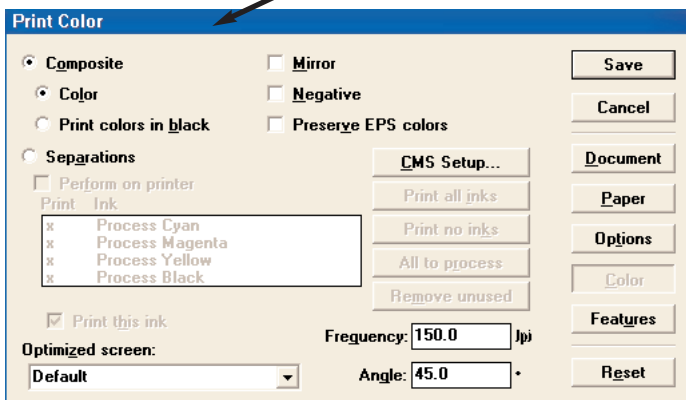
2. Make Sure under **"Paper"** you set the **"Size"** to your Document or to **"Custom"** and add 1" to the size for **"Printer's Marks"** and **"Crop Marks"**



3. Make sure under **"Options"** you follow the Screen Shot then click on the **"Browse"** button. Create a folder on the Desktop and call it **"Postscript"**, then name the file with a ".ps" extension into this folder.



4. The **"Color"** button can look as follows.



You will see a file with a **".PS"** at the end of the file name. Take this file and open it with Acrobat Distiller (Comes with Acrobat or Pagemaker) with the Turley Settings.
